Mount Morris, Jan 5 .- Mr. Wagner, a special representative of the Public Servicy Commission, came to Mount Morris today to investigate the complaint of the village against the Pavillon Natural Gas Company. He interviewed a number of prominent residents of the village, and learned the vance conditions of the gas shortage in Mount Morris during the past everal weeks

It is also understood that he secured information from the Pavilion Natural Gas Company explaining why it nas been unable to furnish gas in sufficient quantity for it many asters. He will report back to the commission, and the decision of this body will be awaited with interest. The gas company in its answer to the complainant claims that there was a shortage of gas and that this was the only reason why they could not furnish it. They also asked that the complaint be dismissed.




