New Cabins At Big Lake

Construction will begin next month on eight new rental cabins at Big Lake State Park near Bigelow, Mo., in Holt County. Each new cabin will contain two bedrooms, living area, kitchen, bath and fireplace. The new cabins will replace the ones damaged by a flood in July 1984. These old cabins will eventually be removed.

The contract for construction of the cabins has been awarded to Pioneer Design Contractors Inc., Hamilton, Mo., for \$468,061. Construction will begin the middle of September. If the weather conditions are favorable, the

cabins should be completed for use next season.

The majority of the funds for the new cabins will come from the one-tenth-of-one-percent parks and soils sales tax approved by voters in 1984. The remaining funds will come from the statewide bond issue approved in 1982.

The cabins will be constructed along Big Lake, which is one of the main features of the 110-acre park. The lake has an excellent reputation for fishing. It also provides opportunities for boating, swimming and bird watching.

This 615-acre natural oxbow lake

also will be the focus of a major project that is scheduled to begin in the spring of 1987. Approximately \$630,000 has been budgeted to begin dredging the lake of silt that has accumulated. This money will come from both the parks and soils sales tax and the statewide bond issue.

Big Lake State Park, located 11 miles southwest of Mound City on Missouri Highway 111, has a campground, picnic areas, dining lodge and motel. It is one of more than 70 state parks and historic sites administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources.
